From the Pastor: Christmas at a Distance

Christmas 2020 will be unlike any Christmas of recent memory, unlike any most of us have ever experienced. While we are all getting weary of communications about the changes in life Covid has forced on us, I feel that it's necessary to address it again with respect to our Christmas celebrations. The last major holiday of the Church Year was completely interrupted by a complete shut-down; it is my hope that we will avoid cancelling Christmas at St. John's. It will, however, look a little different than normal.

First, I'll reiterate some basic precautions. If you're sick, feel sick, or think you might be sick, please stay at home. If you come into contact with someone who is positive for Covid, please stay home for 14 days. If you travel out of state or to a larger family gathering for the holidays, please stay home for 14 days. In most cases, this will mean missing church for one week.

Second, I'm requesting a few additional practices when you do attend public services. We'll continue to wash hands and sanitize, especially in preparing and serving communion. We'll also continue to observe our distancing practices. Because of the increased number of cases and less fresh air during the winter months, I am asking that everyone wear their face coverings while in the building - even when seated.

We are planning to maintain in-person worship services throughout the season. Our building capacity under the new advisory remains at 50. We have not yet reached capacity since reopening. I will not be setting up a reservation system for our services, but I ask that you keep this under consideration when making your Christmas plans.

We will live-stream our 11AM service every Sunday on our Youtube page. In addition, we will also live-stream our special holiday services. Wednesday, December 2, 9, & 16 at 6PM will be Advent Evening Prayer. Christmas Eve services will be Thursday, December 24 at 4:30 & 11PM. Christmas Day is Friday, December 25 at 9:30AM We will have a New Year's Eve service on Thursday, December 31 at 6PM.

In addition our services, we hope to provide one or two other opportunities for virtual fellowship to celebrate Christmas at a distance. Watch your email or Facebook for more information.



From the Principal: St. John's Lutheran School has had a successful three months of in-person learning. But as the community spread of Covid -19 has continued to increase, St. John's will be moving to remote/distance learning during the upcoming Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons. A statement to St. John's parents follows.

"St. John's Board of Christian Education and I understand that people might travel during the holiday season and obviously when people do travel, particularly to States that are defined as COVID hot spots, there is the potential that they would get sick and bring it back in. We also recognize that it is going to be very difficult to spend Thanksgiving and Christmas without seeing loved ones. You continue to be encouraged to follow the federal, State and local recommendations regarding holiday celebrations! We understand that remote learning is not the optimal way of instruction. We also understand that stress it places upon our St. John's students and their families. But we also believe that by following the above course of action St. John's Lutheran School will be better positioned to complete the school year with in-person instruction beginning of January 19th, 2020."

St. John's is able to make this instructional shift due to our outstanding teachers and the technology and curriculum upgrades provided by the Chicagoland Lutheran Education Foundation.

- **27.** That God would grant us faith to believe that He comes to us in the Means of Grace.
- **28.** For all those who face depression and desperation at this time of year. That God's gift of love in Christ would gladden their hearts.

Stewardship Under the Cross, God's Word on How We Use His Gifts

Overcoming the Fear of Tithing

Your heart will always go where you put God's money.

Jesus said that where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. As the hymn verse has it: We give Thee but Thine own. God is the ultimate giver of our incomes: all these gifts come from him. To acknowledge this gift and our dependence on the Lord, God calls us to give a portion of our income back to Him for the maintenance of His Church. Indeed, the Scriptures are very clear: God calls His people to give at least a tithe of their income (10% of whatever "comes in") back to Him at their place of worship.

This calls for faith. Do we trust God's Word? Do we trust that what He says is for our benefit, not our harm? **If you have never tithed before, it can be a scary proposition**. *Give 10% of my income away!? You've got to be kidding.* But God doesn't ever kid us in His Word. Instead, He tells us how to live holy and blessed lives full of peace and contentment. Consider these Scriptures:

Jesus said, "<u>Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth</u>, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. <u>For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also</u> (Matthew 6:19-21).

"Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. But you ask, <u>'How do we rob you?'</u> "<u>In tithes and offerings</u>. ⁹ You are under a curse—the whole nation of you—because you are robbing me. ¹⁰ Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this, "says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it "(Malachi 3:8-10).

On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as each one of you may prosper (1 Corinthians 16:2).

But just as you excel in everything-- in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us --see that you also excel in this grace of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7).

The point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for <u>God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work (2 Cor. 9:6-8).</u>

We do not make God poor when we fall to give money to Him properly, but we *do* make ourselves poor if we do not give according to the standards He sets for us in His Word, the Bible. God does not need our money, but we need to give the way the Bible tells us to in order to overcome the negative influence money and the things of this world can have on us.

God will never tell us to do something that will be to our harm — He loves us too much for that. Jesus gave His life on the cross for me. He loves me and knows what is best for me — so I can know that what He says about stewardship is meant for my benefit. He wants my heart to be with Him — and my heart will always follow where I put God's money. **Tithing is not easy: It is godly. It will change your life.** Stepping out in faith always does. You may have to change your lifestyle to accommodate following God's Word in this matter. But tithing will change your life in other ways too: it will give you a peace and contentment that can only come from actually putting yourself in the hands of the Lord.

So read through those Scriptures again. Pray through the questions on the next page. And step out in faith this year with giving that is in accord with God's Word. And just see if you are not blessed in it.
